



COVID-19 UPDATE

Sitka Fine Arts Camp is excited to resume normal camp activities with full capacity for summer 2022, based on recommendations from:

- Southeast Alaska Regional Health Consortium (SEARHC)
- Alaska Department of Health & Social Services (DHSS)
- American Camp Association (ACA)
- Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)

We continue to closely monitor the status of the pandemic. The information below is subject to change as recommendations evolve.

VACCINATION REQUIREMENT:

All students and staff are required to be up to date on their Covid-19 vaccination to participate in Camp 2022.

Covid-19 vaccines include any approved by the [World Health Organization](#) or U.S. [Food and Drug Administration](#) (FDA), including Pfizer (for all students) and Moderna or Johnson & Johnson (for those 18 and over). Students must be up to date on their vaccination to attend Camp per [CDC guidelines](#), meaning they are fully vaccinated and have received a booster (if eligible) prior to their arrival on campus. (To check your child's vaccination status refer to CDC guidelines [here](#).) Proof of vaccination is due May 1 by uploading a photo of your child's vaccination card to their [campintouch account](#). Please contact us before registering if your student has a medical exemption from vaccination.

THE IMPORTANCE OF COMING TO CAMP HEALTHY:

Coming to camp healthy is the best way to enjoy your camp experience and ensure that our camp community remains healthy and everyone is able to participate in all activities.

- We recommend you take all precautions to limit exposure for 7 days before coming to camp. (We recommend limiting exposure to non-household members, wearing a face mask around non-household members, avoiding gatherings and crowds & limiting unnecessary travel.)
- Please wear a high quality mask during your travel to camp.

TESTING REQUIREMENTS:

Elementary Camp

- Out of town students and any students who travel within 7 days before camp must take a Covid-19 test within 72 hours before arrival at camp and bring a photo or printed record with proof of a negative test result to registration. PCR tests are recommended. Rapid tests also meet our requirements.



Middle School, High School, Musical Theater

- All students must take a Covid-19 test within 72 hours before arrival at camp and bring a photo or printed record with proof of a negative test result to registration. PCR tests are recommended. Rapid tests also meet our requirements.
- Testing will be available for students with symptoms of Covid-19 during camp and upon request.

We are confident in resuming our normal camp activities this summer with health strategies in place combined with vaccination of our students, staff and faculty.

- We will continue to encourage hand hygiene, covering coughs and sneezes, and visiting the nurse if symptoms of illness appear.
- We will follow [CDC guidelines for quarantine and isolation](#) if a student tests positive for Covid-19 or if a roommate is a close contact.
- If your student tests positive for Covid-19, we will contact you and they will be isolated until parents or guardians resume care or they are able to travel home. Families will be responsible for any additional expenses related to health care, quarantine/isolation, or an extended stay.
