

### **Final Performance Overview:**

Final Performances at the Sitka Fine Arts Camp are held over the final 3-4 evenings of camp. They are held at either the Odess Theater or off-campus at the Sitka Performing Arts Center (PAC). There are also smaller group final performances in the afternoon of the last day of camp held in large classroom spaces. Performances are an important part of the camp experience, however we believe at camp that process is always more important than product. We ask that performances are subservient to our central goal of teaching and learning for every child. We would rather you teach more and polish less.

- For classes performing in the PAC or Odess, your faculty packet will include a performance schedule and dress rehearsal schedule including location and exact times.
- Performers are required to be ready to enter and exit the stage at the exact times to the minute indicated. In respect of others, you will not be given extra time. It is your responsibility to make sure your performers are ready.
- Times include the amount of time it takes for your group to get on and off the stage and include set and strike time. Please plan accordingly.
- The dress rehearsal is typically 5 minutes longer than your actual performance time to allow for practicing transitions on and off stage or to go over any specific tech needs. Depending on time constraints, you may not have time to run your entire program during the dress rehearsal. Because of this we recommend that the last day of class before your performance is used to run your program.
- Tech advance forms for all final performances are required to be submitted by the end of the first Friday of camp. Provide complete information for our tech team to be prepared for dress rehearsals and so programs can be printed with correct information.
- Transportation is provided for performers to the Sitka Performing Arts Center. The buses will leave at the time indicated from Rasmuson Center. Please make sure your students make the bus on time with the materials they need. The counseling staff will provide assistance in loading the buses.
- Students will be dropped off at the Sitka High School Commons at the front of the high school. Groups will be rehearsing in performance order. Groups should be ready to proceed in performance order from the Commons, to Room A, to Room B, to backstage. Back stage must be silent. Counselors will serve as room attendants and will cue room transitions. Faculty are responsible for their performers and should stay with their groups until your dress rehearsal is over.
- Room A and B need to be clear of personal items in order to allow for warm ups. Instrument cases and personal items should be stored in the Commons.
- After rehearsing students should return to the Commons. After performing, performers should proceed quietly to the audience space to be seated during applause.
- Faculty are free to leave after all of their classes have done their dress rehearsal.
- Dress-code: All performers are required to dress appropriately for performances. Orchestra, concert band, jazz band, and choir members are required to perform in white dress shirts and black bottoms including dress shoes. Dress choice is at the discretion of theater and dance instructors and often include costumes\*.

\*SFAC has a small costume shop where costumes can be checked out. Costumes may be checked out from the costume shop during Rec Time on the second Monday of Camp.

Please note that performances held in the afternoon of the last day do not have scheduled dress rehearsals in the performance space. Teachers should rehearse in their classroom the last day of class.

### Sitka Fine Arts Camp Art Show Information

The Art Show at the Sitka Fine Arts Camp are held from 1-4pm on the last day of camp (Friday for Middle School Camp & Saturday for High School Camp). The show is in the Yaw Art Center, ceramics building, and computer lab. There are also other performances that happen concurrently from 2-4pm that day in other classrooms around the Sitka Fine Arts Campus. Many parents and community members attend. The show is an important part of the camp experience, however we believe at camp that process is always more important than product. We ask that the show of work is subservient to our central goal of teaching and learning for every child. We would rather you teach more and polish less.

- The Yaw Art Center will be covered with art. All classroom and hallway walls and tables are available for display space. The ceramics classes display their artwork in the ceramics building. The animation and film classes will run screenings in Yaw Art Center room 107. The digital art classes will display their work in the computer lab.
- 2-D Work is hung with push-pins. No framing or matting is necessary. Easels can also be used.
- 3-D Work is displayed on tables or the white studio pedestals.
- Digital work (photos, graphic design, digital paintings) is displayed on computer screens in looping sequences in the computer lab. Each computer can have a different sequence of art. There is limited capacity for printing digital work. If you do want to print work, please print 1 piece per student.
- It is up to the teachers to collectively decide how to share the display space, easels, and pedestals in the Yaw Art Center. Some classes may have more work to display than others. You are not restricted to hanging art in the class where you made the art, but please be mindful of everyone else's space as well.
- You may hang art in the hallway throughout the session, but if you do so, make sure you coordinate with other faculty so that you are mindful of how space will be shared for the final show. I.e. if you cover the entire hallway with work, there will not be space for other classes when the rest of the work is hung.
- **Animation & Film Screenings:** Room 107 in the Yaw Art Center is set up with a projector and audience chairs for screenings every 30 minutes on the half-hour. The entire showing should fit within 25 minutes so each screening will be the same and to allow for transition time. If the room is full, guests can come back for the next showing.

- **Ceramics:** Ceramics teachers will coordinate how to display work in the ceramics building.
- Vases and jars are available if you'd like to collect flowers for the show from around campus. Please spread out where you pick flowers so our gardens stay beautiful.
- We would like to see work from every student. Do not select only the most polished work to show. It is also fine to display process-based work in addition to final pieces.
- The Visual Arts Intern assist with getting supplies for the art show and help coordinate the show during set up times. Students are responsible for cleaning classrooms and hanging artwork.
- **Timeline:**
  - **Middle School Camp:**
    - Wednesday is the last full day of classes
    - Thursday has a shortened class schedule with 40 minute classes that are over by noon.
    - Friday there are no classes.
    - Thursday afternoon and Friday morning are for classroom clean up and art show set up. Ask your students to come help with cleaning the classroom and hanging art. Some students will be involved in dress rehearsals for other classes.
    - Friday 1-4pm Art Show
    - Friday 4:00-5:30pm Artwork pick up and show clean up
  - **High School Camp:**
    - Thursday is the last full day of classes
    - Friday has a shortened class schedule with 40 minute classes that are over by noon.

- Saturday there are no classes.
- Friday afternoon and Saturday morning are for classroom clean up and art show set up. Ask your students to come help with cleaning the classroom and hanging art. Some students will be involved in dress rehearsals for other classes.
- Saturday 1-4pm Art Show
- Saturday 4:00-5:30pm Artwork pick up and show clean up
- Faculty are expected to
  - Clean your classroom space
  - Clean and organize all art supplies and leave them in a neat pile in your classroom or in the classroom cabinets. Let the Visual Arts Intern know if there is any equipment that is not working properly or needs to be replaced for future classes.
  - Hang artwork
  - Be present at the art show to talk with students and parents
  - Take down artwork after the show & leave the classroom tidy and clean.
  - Involve your students in classroom cleaning, art show hanging and clean up.
- Artwork pick up: **Students must collect their artwork at 4pm after the art show ends and before dinner at 5:30pm.** Even if they don't want their work, they have to collect it and dispose of it themselves. Any leftover artwork will be thrown away. When students forget to pick up their work, they are often not able to find it again. Make sure you remind students several times in the last few days of class and during show set up.
